Using data from the number of students ho graduate with the minor in initial Justice, SDSU anticipates graduating 20 majors in five years, 30 in six years, 35 in seven years, and 40 each year after the proposed program fills a demonstrated need for SDSU. Enrollment in the Criminal Justice in has risen from 58 students fall 2015 to 131 students in fall 2018. This increase in enrollment indicates a high degree of student interest in the field. The creation of a Criminology major will allow interested students to pursue a baccalaureate program in a related field without leaving SDSU.
