#### 8. Explanation of the Change:

The American Association of Colleges of Nursing recently updated the standards for nursing education. These standards were adopted by the Commission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE), which accredits SDSU College of Nursing programs, including the DNP. The DNP program was updated to reflect the new accreditation standards and requirements, including meeting the requirements for clinical hours. The number of clinical hours and, therefore, credit hours were increased to meet accreditation requirements. The College of Nursing identified the following changes:
