These standards were adopted from mission on Collegiate Nursing Education (CCNE), which accredits SDSU College of Nursing programs, including the The control Graduate Psychiatric Mental Health Nurse Practitioner Certificate am was updated to reflect thenew accreditation standards and requirements, including meeting the requirements for clinical hours. The number of clinical hours and, therefore dit hours were increased to meet accreditation requirements. The College of Nursing identified the following changes:

NURS 733Psychopathological Disorders Across the Lifespeatuced from 3 to 2 creditshe content of the course was adjusted due to certification requirements

NURS 734 was modified to separate out NURS 734 for didactic content and NURS 734L for the practicum experience. This change will provide clarity for students when registering and workload allocation

NURS 736Psychiatric/Mental Health Advanced Practice Across the Lifes prandased from 4 to 5 credits o accommodate the increased number of clinical hours required for accreditation.
